About 120 people took part in a rainy 5-kilometer and 10-kilometer Run for Conservation here Saturday, and President Ronald Reagan took note of the Lawrence event Monday with a telegram.

The "run" was sponsored by the Douglas County Conservation District to celebrate the 50th year of the national soil and water conservation movement. Don Palmateer, chairman for the conservation district, Monday received the following telegram from President Reagan.

"I am delighted to extend my greetings to all those in the Douglas County Conservation District who gathered for a run for conservation.
